MOTHERHOOD

ARUTHRA

The expectations of a pregnant mother can't be expressed in words. Rarely when nature deviates from its amazing perfectionism, it could shatter the family. Such was the state when Aruthra was born with an uncommon condition called Pierre Robin Syndrome. The lower jaw is small and pushed back, leaving little space for the tongue. The spatial relationship was so compromised that Aruthra was not able to lie flat on the back, frequently getting choked. Feeding was almost impossible. Child had to be nursed on the face all the time.

The problem occurs over a spectrum with very minor difference to a severe state like what Aruthra had where breathing, swallowing and breast feeding all become next to impossible. Children with such severe deformity need to have their jaws pulled forward. It involves breaking the lower jaw bone, putting some pins on either side and slowly distracting the cut ends. As the bone fragments slowly move, new bone gets deposited in between getting the jaw to normal size. The whole process takes a few weeks. Soon Aruthra started taking normal feeds, gained weight and for the first time, her mother put her to sleep on the back without worrying if Aruthra will have breathing difficulty.

We know how difficult it could be for parents to see what their newborn child has to go through. We take care to explain, spend time to answer questions and reassure that the child will do well. Looking back her parents feel that surgery has done something wonderful for the family as a whole. It has not only helped Aruthra but also her parents to sleep peacefully in the night.



MAKING A HAPPY HOME MANSI

Gunjans are a happy family now. Two years back they were struck with uncertainty. Mansi fractured her arm bone with loss of soft tissues when the car overturned in an accident at Gurgoan. Sometimes things do not go well as planned. The wound got infected, fracture remained ununited and she went through a series of orthopaedic and reconstructive surgical procedures (reverse radial forearm flap, pedicled LD flap and a free Anterolateral thigh flap and multiple skin and bone grafting procedures). Still she was left with infection, a bone gap with lot of scarred tissues in the arm with a wrist and finger drop.

They reached a stage where they would venture at anything which would ensure success. Gunjan was working in a multinational company, and they explored the possibility of treatment abroad. To their surprise, they were referred back to Coimbatore.

Doing the microvascular procedure of transferring bone from the leg was a challenge both in finding good vessels and in the fixation of bone. The combined expertise of the Plastic Surgical and Orthopaedic teams at Ganga met the challenge. The procedure was successful and after tendon transfers she is able to do all that she wanted to do as a mother, wife and a career woman. As reconstructive surgeons we just don't reconstruct limbs but also bring peace and happiness at home.

TAKING THE RIGHT CALL MATRU YADAV

It all happened in a fraction of a second. A blast in an ammunition factory blew away Matru Yadav. It destroyed his right forearm and the amputated right hand was blown 40 feet away. The left hand was destroyed beyond salvage. In addition he had multiple injuries in the abdomen and legs. He arrived in a state of shock and on the verge of collapse. The Ganga Protocol of 'In Theatre Resuscitation', was set in motion.

A brief assessment made us realize that he will lose both his hands. The amputated right hand was in the ice box. We decided to attach the amputated right hand to the left forearm, since the right forearm was blown away in the blast. It meant a decision to take on a 6 hour surgery, on a patient who is just being resuscitated with a Hb of 5 gm. We could trust the skill levels and commitment of our anaesthesia team to take such decisions.

There is no road map when we do such surgery. Decisions on surgical steps had to be taken as we went along in order to make the fingers and thumb function in the opposite position. Three months of intense therapy followed. Now it is amazing to see Matru Yadav use his 'right' hand in the left side for eating, writing, wearing clothes and for taking calls. Later we realized that this is the **second such cross hand replant at this level in the world**.

At times of crisis, taking the right call demands an attitude of not giving up. An attitude which stems from decades of experience. We are happy that we did it for Matru Yadav.

EDUCATION

SARASWATHI

Vijayanarayanan and Vishalakshi make their livelihood by selling vegetables in a pushcart in the streets of Coimbatore. They have never been to school. They named their daughter Saraswathi, after the Goddess of learning and education.


When Saraswathi was 3 years old, when their parents were away at work, she was playing in the neighbour's home. There was a bucket of hot water on a table. She jumped on the table, tripped and in a moment the water which was boiling hot was all over her. Life was saved but she was left with severe deformities in the right elbow and hand. The nimble fingers of a 4 year old were stiff and useless. The hopes of the parents in giving her an education seemed far away.

We don't view them as pure medical problems. They are social catastrophes. Mother's time at work gets reduced, family income comes down when they really needed more, and most important Saraswathi was not enrolled into school. Somewhere, someone has to break this negative cycle. The 'Hope after Fire' project of Rotary Club of Coimbatore Metropolis and Ganga Hospital provided the answer.

The contractures were released and the severe one in the hand required a flap from the abdomen. Now she is enrolled in school. What could have costed a lakh of rupees was done totally free. The joy in the family is palpable. They hope one day she will be an 'educated mother'.

Nurturing hope of a better tomorrow, keeping the dreams alive, that is what reconstructive surgery is all about.

SPECIAL MOMENTS

PERUMAL

A 67 year old farmer from Namakkal was taking good care of his diabetes but did not realize the gradual loss of sensation in his feet. Hard farm work added to the stress. Right foot bones collapsed with total loss of architecture. Instability led to a fall and a fracture, the fixation of which also failed. Now he had to bear weight on the outer border of the unstable foot. The foot ulcerated under pressure and that confined him to the house for 2 years. He was advised a below knee amputation, as a good option to get his mobility back. As a last resort he approached us.

Mobility is a key issue in maintaining independence in old age. When it is lost it has a severe impact on the quality of life. As in the case of Perumal he was unable to attend to his farm, social functions or even go to his family temple close by for fear of worsening the ulcer. The restricted life leads to social isolation, loneliness and a fear of the future.

Perumal requested our diabetic foot reconstruction team to make one more effort at salvage. When we do a thing we put in our best efforts no matter what it takes. First we made the wounds heal by skin grafting. In the second stage we fixed the ankle bones. The wound healing problems were successfully managed. It is two years now.

On a recent visit he gave us a photograph (Perumal, third from right), and thanked us profusely for what we did to him. He said that he attended the wedding of a loved one, which he had looked forward to all his life. When he posed for that photograph, he thought about us and thanked God for making it possible.

If a patient registered in a previous year comes for a follow-up surgery, the number is reflected in the number of surgical procedures but does not get added in the new patient list. (For example, a former brachial plexus injury patient coming for free functioning muscle transfer or a previous hand injury patient coming for tendon transfer or nerve graft, will not be considered as a new patient, but the procedures done will get reflected under the list of procedures)

Hand Surgery

Our core strength lies here and we work hard to maintain the leadership position. It has not been difficult, because we love the field. We analyze and introspect every step that we take and the results achieved. We work on the whole canvas of hand surgical problems. The proportion of chronic diseases and secondary reconstructions have increased and the patients come from far and near. Distance no longer appears to be the barrier for a discerning patient to seek the medical help that he deserves. We work hard to make them feel that it is the best decision they ever made. We want to be the 'one stop solution provider', for any hand condition. We have added value to our work by making a special division for wrist surgery and wrist arthroscopy. We have strengthened the physiotherapy department. We make the splints and the compression garments in house. Our social workers go to the limits possible to rehabilitate every hand injury patient from getting them certificates to becoming an entrepreneur. This is a field where we truly reconstruct lives.

Micro surgery

As we go along we have noted that the complexity of the reconstructions that we do have increased - making possible some 'last resort' salvages. The series of Capanna technique for major bone defects, the increasing number of Free Functioning Muscle transfers in Brachial Plexus injuries and Facial nerve paralysis are a few of them. Though the absolute number of emergency replants and revascularisations have reduced (happily coinciding with the increasing safety standards and education), we still push the boundaries of useful salvage. Our expanding indications for major replants are a case in point.

Considering the emergency micro work, the free flaps, brachial plexus surgeries and major nerve reconstructions **quality microsurgery is an everyday happening at Ganga**. It helps to keep up our skills and increases the operational efficiency.

Brachial Plexus Surgery

We are proud that the brachial plexus reconstruction division has grown significantly in the past 2 years both in the range and depth of services provided. The geographical reach has extended with many patients travelling more than thousand kilometers.

The Unit has evolved to provide comprehensive care to every Brachial Plexus injury patient. We treat both adult and birth brachial plexus injuries and the skill sets are available for doing primary nerve surgery both in children and adults. We are also capable of doing wide range of secondary procedures to improve function.

The capacity to do tendon transfers to osteotomy to free functioning muscle transfer (we just crossed the 100 mark in free functioning muscle transfer) allows us to choose what is best for the patient.

We are happy that we stay in the forefront in providing comprehensive services for this disabling condition.

These two years saw growth in volume and spectrum of procedures done. The main bulk continues to be trauma related procedures, we having close to 350 major facial fracture fixations and trauma related surgeries done every year. To this we wanted to add value and started dental implant services for replacing missing teeth. The taking in of an Orthodontist and starting the dental clinic has helped us rehabilitate trauma patients. Since most of them form part of the polytrauma cases having long bone fractures, provision of comprehensive care has been welcomed by the patients.

In widening the scope of services provided we have gone into craniofacial surgery. We are grateful to Dr K Sridhar for helping us start this service and we are now working independently. In addition, surgery for facial nerve paralysis and orthognathic surgery showed an increase during this period.



The division also caters to chronic wounds with gratifying results. We predict that this will be one of the fields which will drive the growth curve of the department in the coming years.

Burns

This field has created the maximum social impact in the two years under review. Our acute burns care improved with steady increase in the number and quality of survival of major burns patients. This has been helped by the starting of the Ganga Skin Bank, with the help of the National Burns Centre, Mumbai.

As surgeons our job does not stop with operating on the people who seek our help. In the society there are unfortunate people who are not under any social net. Burn survivors with major deformities come under this heading. For them living is the painful result of surviving the major burns. The 'Hope after Fire', project done in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Coimbatore Metropolis serves as a beacon of hope for them. We have done 281 major reconstructions on 179 patients valued at more than Rs.1 crore. The journey continues and our resolve to reach the unreached is becoming stronger.

Hope after Fire is a project to provide **FREE** reconstructive surgery for the correction of deformities caused by burns. It is a joint initiative of the Rotary Club of Coimbatore Metropolis and Ganga Hospital. Burn survivors suffer from severe deformities of the face and hands which leave their post survival life in tatters. Most of them need complex procedures, staged reconstructions and continued therapy. It could be expensive and facilities are not available in most places. This project is to bridge that gap.


The project initiated in 2011, during the presidency of Rtn. PP Venkatesh, has grown in strength due to the tremendous commitment of the members of the Rotary Club of Coimbatore Metropolis and the Plastic Surgical team of Ganga Hospital. The Rotary takes care of the Hospital expenses and the consumables and the surgery is done free. Presently the project value has crossed over a crore of rupees, and we have pledges for a similar sum for the future. It just proves the power of a good purpose.

The ICU is equipped with state of the art ventilators, monitors, video bronchoscopes and point of care ultrasound facilities. In our intensive care unit patients receive evidence based care by well trained multi disciplinary team led by full time Intensivist.

ICU nurses form the back bone of hospital **CODE BLUE** team. The critical care outreach service managed by ICU team helps in identification and treatment of high risk patients and also in the smooth transition of care from ICU to ward care. The multi disciplinary team involving dietician and physiotherapists takes care of ICU nutrition and rehabilitative process.

BLOOD BANK

We are proud of our blood bank and laboratory services as they rise up to meet the demands of the major trauma patients. We have one of the most sophisticated laboratories to process various clinical biochemistry, clinical pathology, serology, immunoassay, haematology and microbiology samples. We are enrolled in various internationally acclaimed External Quality and Internal Quality Assurance Programmes.

As a Regional Blood bank, we run camps for collecting blood and encourage voluntary blood donors. We have component separation facility. In the last two years we have encouraged the trend of autologous blood transfusion and it has worked out well for our elective surgeries. About 11,000 units of blood and blood products are issued every year and 95% of it is consumed in house and the rest supports nearby hospitals.

The department is led by Mrs Deepa Satish and Dr Rohini Tiwari and has 14 dieticians (1: 35 patient ratio), 7 supervisors and a total staff strength of 126. On an average 1200 meals are prepared every session. They have received 69 students per year for internship from catering colleges and have published and presented in national conferences and bagged awards. 

Incharges of Skin Bank

Manoj and Arani's whole family fell victim to burns when a gas leak went unnoticed at home. Their mother lit the gas stove for coffee, which brought their home down in flames. Arani and Manoj along with two of their cousins, mother, uncle and aunt got caught in the flames and are slowly recovering, thanks to the support of skin donors. It is the kind act of skin donors that has saved the lives of these victims.

- Skin just like eyes can be donated within 6 hours after death.
- Skin harvest can be done at home.
- It is processed and stored skin can be used for up to 5 years.
 Hence there is no chance for wastage of the donation.
- The processed skin loses its antigenicity and hence can be used for anyone without matching of blood groups.
- The donated skin greatly helps to tide over the crisis period of a major burn patient by serving as a temporary cover to prevent infection and fluid loss in the immediate post burn period.

EXPANSION OF OUR WRIST SURGERY DEPARTMENT.



We are alive to the increasing demands of our patients with wrist pain, sports injuries and management of complex wrist fractures. In addition to the expansion of our outpatient and therapy services for wrist problems, we have added Wrist Arthroscopy services when we acquired the state of art Stryker wrist arthroscope.

allows us to provide comprehensive care to our patients with wrist problems.

DENTAL SERVICES



Dr Angeline Archana, Orthodontist joined as full time specialist in our department in Jan 2014. The goal in taking her in was to enhance our services in our cleft care programme, and also to facilitate Orthognathic procedures. She has started naso alveolar moulding (NAM) for cleft children and our Orthognathic work output has also increased.

Incidentally we found that she added value to our services that we offered to our patients with major facio maxillary injuries. A comprehensive dental services programme is now in place by her liasoning

with other specialists, so that services are now provided in house for problems ranging from a broken tooth to implants after free flap transfer.





We feel fortunate to have shared the journey for a short distance in the reprinting of the 2nd edition and preparation of the 3rd edition which acts as a companion volume for the tapes. Incidentally it is also worth to mention that Dr Acland handed over the copyright of the book to the Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand (ISSH). Ganga Hospital was instrumental in publishing the manual and distributing it. Close to Rs. 40 lakhs have been generated from the sales of the book and the entire amount has been donated to the corpus of ISSH.

An international fellowship titled "Dr. Robert Acland International Traveling Fellowship" has been created in ISSH to enable an Indian hand surgeon to visit centres abroad.

Dear Raja,

This is the original handwritten script for my 1963 instructional video "Flat Femorial Artery Anastomosis'. I am sending it to you as a gift in recognition of our long triandship and your commitment to the educational tradition to which we belong.

Originally, sets of the double sheets of yellow paper were taped to each other to make long accordion-pleated scrolls, that stretched the length of a long table. When I took these out of the file where they had been tightly folded for many years, the transverse running capo began to fall apart, so I disassambled the scroffs and stapled them together along the edge. The script is in feur sections: 1) Introduction and equipment, 2) Vessel dissection; 3) Vesel end preparation; and 4) Suturing and tests of patency. The first three sections are bandwritten; the fourth was typed out by my patient secretary.

The script was written partly on the basis of my own well remembered struggles to learn an effective anastometic technique as I worked alone in the early 1970s. Those memories were reinforced by observing the work of trainers in the University of Louisville Microsurgery Teaching Lab under my instruction, beginning in 1975. I foit the trainees' successes and failures reflected success and failure on my part as. an instructor, and I made constant improvements to my instruction. This went on for years, week after week, teaching a fresh group of 3 or 4 trainers each week. Up until 1980 I taught directly, with a video camera on the microscope and the trainers sitting close to me, watching on a monitor. It was easy to add new points of emphasis to my instruction, and then observe the effect of those improvements. What a teaching experience, for me as an instructor!

By 1980 my weekly demonstrations were as good as I knew sow to make them, and I decided to start making videotapes. These were surprisingly effective: It seemed the trainees learned better from them than from my live instruction. This was partly because trainees could watch and re-watch the tape when it justed them; partly because the distraction of my presence was removed, and partly because on tape I could more graphically show mistakes and their consequences.

The 1983 artery tape was an improvement on a 1981 version that is new lost. It was the first tape I made, in which I wrote and recorded the spoken words first, and then created the video with care to make the actions coincide exactly with the words. I have followed this principle ever since. It's much easier to do on a computer than it was back then?

Going Bevond Medicine

We count our efforts as successful only when our patients are actively rehabilitated back as useful members of the society. Our social workers do just that. They obtained quality free prosthesis for 6 patients, obtained free bus passes between their homes to Ganga Hospital for physiotherapy for 17 major hand injury patients, total bus passes for 70 severely disabled people, Government pensions and grants to 26 patients, helped arrange jobs for 5 persons, and provided free tailoring machines to 2 persons after release of burn contractures. They also organized 12 medical camps which help us reach the unreached. Their strength lies in being a liaison between various NGOs and Government departments so that the needy are served.

Ganga Hand Injury Support Group formed in 2007 (inaugurated by Hon. Justice Shivraj Patil) is actively involved in providing the needed psychological and social support to hand injury patients. It also seeks the help of our previous patients who lead a useful life.



DR RAVINDRA BHAT


